It is a necessity of the programme that candidates be either in employment in the industry or placed in suitable work environments to complete the Degree. All modules contain an employability focus either in contextual teaching and assessment. Care has been taken to ensure that teaching, learning and assessment reflect the industry context and employability skills.

Alternative qualifications considered	A Tariff score of 120 points is the minimum entry threshold for September 2016 entry. From September 2017 minimum entry threshold is 48 points based on the new UCAS Tariff System. The points could come from A level or other qualifications but the student must show a strong interest in a career in tourism, leisure or the hospitality industry. The tariff score cannot come solely from Key Skills level 3. Applicants of 18 years of age by 31st August in the year of entry need to have studied level 3 or above for a minimum of two academic years. Mature entrants are required to demonstrate evidence of recent study and/or relevant vocational experience and a genuine interest the industry.
