Course Structure

Programme Structure Description	The programme is delivered in one year in full time mode and starts in September and will be delivered year-long with a significant period of time taken up with independent study. In full time mode students complete 2x30 credit modules in Semester 1, 2x30 credit modules in Semester 2, and 1x60 credit module in Semester 3. Modules taught in full time mode: Module 7501MFATIN: Intro to theory/research/proposal (30 credits) Module 7502MFATIN: Practice/scoping/experimentation (30 credits) Module 7503MFATIN: Reflection/synthesis/revised proposal (30 credits) Module 7504MFATIN: Practice/ project development (30 credits) Module 7505MFATIN: MFA Thesis - project finalization - reflection - thesis (60 credits) An alternative exit award of Postgraduate Diploma in Creative Practice will be offered to students who have gained 120 credits within the programme. (This must consist of all four 30 credit modules) An alternative exit award of Postgraduate Certificate in Creative Practice will be offered to students who have gained 60 credit modules drawn from 7501/7502/7503/7504) The final 60 credit module cannot be taken into account for the award of the certificate or diploma The Postgraduate Diploma and Postgraduate Certificate are alternative exits and do not recruit directly. Level 7 Potential Awards on completion Master of Fine Arts (MFA) in Creative Practice It should be noted that while on-site residencies are an important part of the learning, development and networking process however they are not a requirement to pass the programme

Alternative qualifications considered	An honours degree at 2:1 classification from a UK University (or equivalent overseas qualification) in a related visual arts degree or equivalent. Applicants from a non-standard background are welcomed. In addition, all potential candidates are required to demonstrate competence in English Language to English GCSE standard or equivalent. Applicants should be able to demonstrate a sufficient level of knowledge to embark upon the programme (including the linguistic competence) and to complete the programme within the time limits. One reference is required. Portfolio of work.
Other international requirements	International qualifications considered in line with UK qualifications. Non-UK students will be required to demonstrate command of English Language at IELTS 6.5 (minimum 5.5 in each component) or equivalent qualification. Applicants who have studied and successfully passed a UK- based degree within the previous 24 months are exempt from such requirements.
