## Course Structure

Programme Structure Description	<p>Meets the requirements of the Bar Standards Board (BSB) for the purpose of a Qualifying Law Degree.</p> <p>The programme is studied over three years (360 credits) full time. Study is undertaken at three levels, one for each year of study. 120 credits are required for the completion of each level and 360 credits for the completion of the full honours programme. The programme is based on a two semester academic year with modules being delivered and assessed in either semester 1 or, semester 2, apart from the year long Dissertation (6500LAWBHO). Students wishing to take 5505LAWBHO Clinical Legal Education I must have passed 4505LAWBHO Law in Society. At Level 4 all modules are core.</p> <p>At Level 5 students will undertake two core modules in semester 1 (5501LAWBHO Justice, Human Rights and the State and 5500LAWBHO Equity and Trusts) and must choose one of the following optional modules in semester 1: 5504LAWBHO International Trade Law, or 5505LAWBHO Clinical Legal Education I. At level 5 in semester 2 students will undertake two core modules 5503LAWBHO Law of The Single Market of the EU and 5502LAWBHO Land Law and must choose one the following option modules in Semester 2: 5508LAWBHO Maritime Law, 5507LAWBHO Succession, Wills and Admin and 5506LAWBHO Criminal Litigation and Advocacy.</p> <p>At Level 6 if students choose to do the dissertation module (6500LAWBHO) then they must additionally choose 40 credits of modules in semester 1 and 40 credits of modules in semester 2. If at L6 students choose not to do the dissertation module then they must choose 60 credits of modules in each semester.</p> <p>At Level 6 if students choose 6500LAWBHO Dissertation then in semester 1 students must choose two of 6502LAWBHO Mediation Skills and Practice, 6501LAWBHO Commercial Law, 6504LAWBHO Mooting, 6505LAWBHO Property Law and Practice, or 6503LAWBHO Civil Dispute Resolution. At Level 6 if students choose 6500LAWBHO Dissertation then in semester 2 students must choose two of 6508LAWBHO Employment Law, 6507LAWBHO Company and Business Organisations Law, 6509LAWBHO Evidence, or 6506LAWBHO Jurisprudence and 6510LAWBHO Negotiation Skills and Practice.</p>
